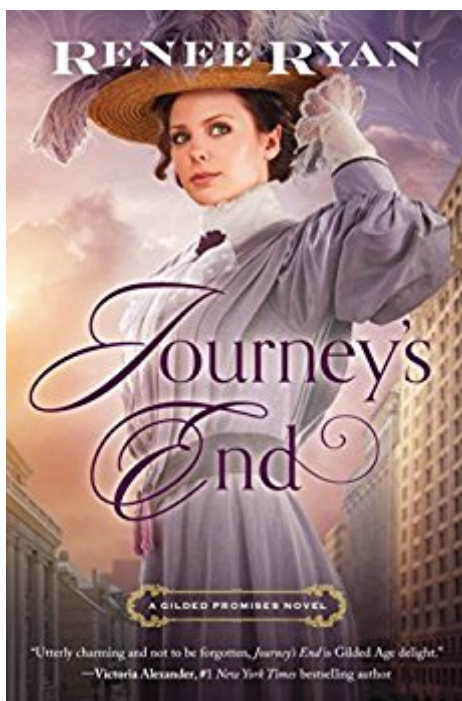

This has to be one of the worse books I have read in a very, very long time. I would give it zero stars if I could. I only finished it because I was given it to me free for a review. The premise of the book is that the heroine's mother was cast aside by her very rich family when she married a stable hand. When

the stable hand died before his daughter was born, her family refused to take her back and she raised her daughter in destitution on the "mean streets of London".
