

Actually, Jews for Jesus, while trying to show the Jewish people that the Messiah was Jewish, erred very much in that they were showing the Jewish people a non-Torah keeping Messiah, and the Jewish people could never/would never accept such a thing. Yeshua would never have had a ham sandwich or attended sunday services or work on a Sabbath. He never broke the law or Torah, so he would have never done or taught such things. He was completely Torah observant and taught others to be also. He didn't observe christmas, or easter or halloween. He did keep all the Biblical Holy days. He was born of the seed of a woman and the seed of the Holy Spirit, so he didn't have a sin nature as the rest of mankind does, as a result of disobedience in the Garden. We don't find it impossible to believe all the miracles of the Tanach, so why do we find a virgin birth that difficult? With G-d, all things are possible. Ask Hashem to show you who the real Yeshua is, and given a little time and a receptive mind and heart, and He will show you.
